What to Expect

The survey is a combination of:

- * Yes and no questions
- * Multiple choice questions
- * Open-ended questions

The questions focus on:

- * Employment
- * Postsecondary education activities
- * Living situations
- * Questions and concerns you have

ADULT LIVING

- Where are you currently living?
- Are you doing things in your free time, like going to a movie, concert, sporting event?
- Does someone help you with things like finding a job, helping you with transportation to work or college, driver's training, or paying for classes or books?
- What problems or difficulties, if any, have you had with things like finding a place to live, getting together with friends, or doing things you enjoy since leaving high school?

POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION AND TRAINING

- Since leaving high school, have you participated in additional education or training, such as college, adult or community education, vocational school, or a humanitarian program like a mission or the Peace Corps?
- Do you use things like computers, spelling, magnifier, calculator, shortened assignments or extended work time at your place of postsecondary education or training?
- Have you participated in postsecondary education or training programs as you planned to while you were in high school?

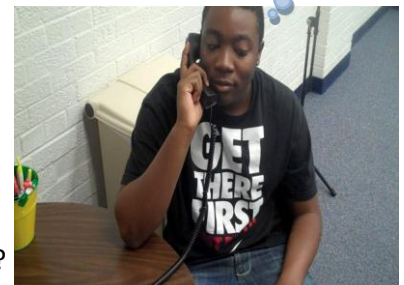
EMPLOYMENT

- Have you been employed since leaving high school?
- On an average, how many hours do you or did you work per week?
- What is your usual hourly wage, including tips?
- How long have you been working at your most recent job?
- Have you worked after high school as you planned while in high school?

- Did you have any type of work experience while you were in high school?
- If you had a job when you left high school, how long did you stay at that job?
- What types of things happened in high school that helped you meet your goals?
